


We look forward to seeing you next term for some Summer fun! Enjoy the holidays!



This term we have been working really hard and discovering lots of new things! Below we will explain everything we have been learning from the Year 4 curriculum.

English

This term, students are becoming more confident and creative writers. Students were challenged to create and write about: a new robot, a disgusting recipe and a new animal; spooky stories, spaceships and superheroes. This term, we can see how Year 4 has improved their creative writing skills and are now writing with more interesting detail, advanced vocabulary and correct punctuation. Furthermore, students have expanded their knowledge of grammar a lot this term and covered many important grammar concepts to help improve their writing. We can see the progress students are making every week in grammar, this is reflected in the weekly test results.

Students continue to enjoy reading every day from the class library and Numont Library. We would like to congratulate those students who have achieved a certificate for 'The Reading Book Challenge'. Don't forget over the holidays you can access GET EPIC reading. Keep up the excellent reading Year 4!





In English, each student created their own newsletter explaining all the fun things we did on Roman Day!

Maths

We have been very impressed by Year 4's great work ethic in Maths this term. We made great progress with adding and subtracting 4 digit numbers. The children also gained confidence multiplying 3 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers. We are also able to divide using the 'chunking chimp method'. Furthermore, we learnt how to find fractions of amounts, as well as finding equivalent and simplifying fractions. We had great fun studying angles, parallel and perpendicular lines. We also revised the properties of 2D shapes. Games and songs were used daily to enhance our learning. We are working hard to know our times tables off by heart. The teachers hope everyone in year 4 receives a times tables certificate by the end of the school year. Well done boys and girls!

<u>Science</u>

We saw students become real life scientists in our Science topic 'Solids, Liquids & Gases'. Children can identify different states of matter in our everyday lives. We also learnt how fizzy drinks were made. We carefully carried out a Science investigation in the Science Lab, we researched how different temperatures of water affect how fast chocolate melts. Students even got to eat some of the evidence after!

Now in Science, we are studying Sound. The children explored different sound sources by walking around the school and investigating different volumes. Children also enjoyed using a tuning fork to create vibrations through the water. We can now explain how sound is created by vibrations. At the end of the unit we will create our own musical instrument that will play sounds of different pitch and loudness.



Geography & History

In Geography this term we have been learning all about China! China is a fascinating country as it has experienced such rapid social and economic change over the last 50 years. Students have expanded their map reading skills and located the countries bordering China. We have also learnt more about the different 'mega cities' of China. We have talked about desertification in China and studied the impressive Great Wall of China! The children are also beginning to learn about Ancient China through the discovery of the Shang Dynasty and its artefacts.

We were also extremely impressed and proud to see each student of Year 4 design their own creative project on China & then present this confidently for the show. We hope families enjoy watching the show as much as we enjoyed creating it. Well done Year 4!

Art & DT

This term we have been learning all about classical and contemporary Chinese art. Children have studied Chinese calligraphy; they enjoyed learning the Chinese alphabet and then writing their own names. Year 4 also loved learning about the significance of dragons in Chinese culture and then drawing their very own Chinese dragon design. Furthermore, they designed and put together a Chinese drum using different materials. They also created their own unique design for an oriental plate typically find in China – the end products were very beautiful.



Now in Art we are studying investigating patterns which was supported by our trip to the Museo de Ilusiones. The children had a fantastic morning investigating visual effects and optical illusions. They have been creating their own patterns in class using repetition, rotation and symmetry.


This term in mathematics Year 5 have worked well on fractions. This key skill will be crucial going forward. This will continue into next term and well into year 6.

Science has focused on Changing Materials and Their Properties. Year 5 have learned about changing states of materials, how solutions can be made, reversible and irreversible changes, which materials have which properties and how these can be used in products we use in daily life.


This term we have been studying Ancient Greece, the birthplace of democracy and philosophy. We produced a musical with an historical theme. Children learnt while having fun but more seriously thought about how the ancient Greeks influenced our thinking to this very day. In art, pupils have been thinking about perspective and vanishing points. We studied the work of M.C Esher and other famous artists over the centuries and how they incorporated perspective into their art work. We also looked at the tricks artists use in their work to deceive and engage people.

Our topic on North America gave children the opportunity to explore different types of maps and learn in detail about both the physical and political geography of North America.




The children have also been continuing to investigate their weekly grammar concept and spelling pattern.




In Mathematics, the children have continued to follow the abacus programme. It has been an interesting half term, as the children have been learning the difference between mean, median and mode. Additionally, they have consolidated their calculation skills and learned the concept of long division. Well done, Year 6!





The first unit studied this term was 'Evolution and Inheritance'. In this topic, the children investigated how to identify the difference between inherited and adaptive traits. They now understand that adaptations are random mutations and they know the difference between selective and cross breeding. The children have developed their understanding of evolutionary ideas and theories over time and enjoyed learning about Darwin.



The second unit year 6 are studying at the moment is was 'Electricity'. The children have been learning about the main circuit symbols and they have been using these to draw circuit diagrams. Furthermore, they have had the opportunity to investigate how our understanding of electricity has changed over time and the children will gain more experience of planning scientific investigations in the next term.



The history topic of World War II has taken the children on a journey to 1939 to find out how children lived during the war. The children loved learning about how the children were evacuated to the countryside and how food was rationed at this time. Year 6 also investigated the role of women in the war and they have learned about the terrible events of the holocaust.







Congratulations to both year six classes who performed outstanding assemblies based on World War II. Unfortunately, we could not have parents as an audience, however, the children donned their costumes, learned their lines and songs and performed their parts like the professional actors they are! We hope you enjoyed the recorded performances of the shows as much as they enjoyed performing them.





This term the children have had two school field trips. The first to the Science Museum in Alcobendas where the children enjoyed a workshop on Electricity and the second trip they had a fabulous interactive workshop on collage and colour. Both school trips were extremely educational and everyone learned a lot and enjoyed them. On both occasions, the museum staff commented on how the children were polite and well behaved. Years 7 and 8

Our KS3 students have enjoyed an exciting spring term. This term, they had the opportunity to choose representatives from each class for the student council.

KS3 English Literature

This term, class 7A have been reading the book, The Old Man and the Sea; class 7B have been reading The Diary of a Young Girl; Year 8 have read the book Of Mice and Men, and the play Blood Brothers. It has been fantastic performing scenes from Blood Brothers with year 8 and we are all looking forward to filming scenes from the play on the last Friday of term.

KS3 English Language

Year 7: This term in English language we have studied two topics: Science Fiction and Travellers' Tales. When studying science fiction, students enjoyed reading and writing science fiction stories, designing their own gadgets and pitching them to their classmates. Students have engaged with a range of different travel texts such as guides, blogs, reviews and adverts; they had a fantastic time designing and writing adverts for their own unique hotels.

Year 8: This term in English language we have studied the topics, Technology Matters and Campaigning for a Cause. Students have practised using their analytical and critical thinking skills to assess the importance of both technological breakthroughs and charitable causes. I have been impressed by the class' ability to work in groups to discuss contrasting opinions and to come to agreements on challenging topics.

KS3 Maths

In Maths, students have been introduced to new concepts like sequences and finding nth -term-rule. Many children find fractions and decimal numbers challenging in KS3; we spent several weeks revising these topics; most of our students now feel much more confident in these areas.




In history this term, we have been learning all about the crusades. We have studied the successes and failures of the First Crusade, the Second Crusade and the Third Crusade and also learned about how people's ideas about the world were changing at this time, particularly in relation to maths and science, and the impact that these developments have had on the world today. We have also looked at the validity of sources and whether you can believe everything that you see and read!

KS3 Science

This term Year 7 have been covering life characteristics, viruses and species in Biology, properties of materials (metals vs non-metals) in Chemistry and Earth Physics.

Both groups have thoroughly enjoyed going to the lab and we have continued to work on key laboratory skills such as using equipment safely, recognizing hazard labels, measuring volume and temperature accurately. We have also run some very interesting experiments with acids and alkalis, and we have used the properties of different materials to separate mixtures.











Our year 8 students are learning about light. They have been learning about The Laws of Reflection using place mirrors, angles of incidence and reflection, refraction, and light speed. Our students are aware that light travels in straight lines called rays. They were intrigued by how white light can be split into many colours using a glass block.

In the picture, our Year 8 students are doing an experiment to investigate the speed of light in different mediums and how the change in speed causes the refraction of an object. They are using water and oil to see which one causes more refraction to prove that the speed of light is different in these mediums.



KS3 Geography

Year 7: This term in Geography we have studied two topics: glaciers and Africa. I have been very impressed by the students' inquisitive nature; we have spent the term having fascinating conversations and the students are developing into fine geographers. It has been wonderful to hear so many students telling me about glacial landforms they have spotted whilst out exploring rural Spain over their weekends. Whilst studying Africa, students have enjoyed completing research projects, drawing their own maps, travelling around Africa using Google Earth and acting as news reporters to educate others about the history of Africa. It has been a fantastic term!

Year 8: This term in Geography we have studied weather and climate and climate change. Despite the challenging scientific concepts taught during these two topics, year 8 have worked incredibly hard this term. Students have learnt how to read weather maps, how to predict weather conditions based on atmospheric conditions, and have developed an excellent understanding of global climate patterns, how they are changing and why. I have been very impressed by year 8's progress in geography this term.

KS3 Music

In Music this term, our topic has been 'I've Got Rhythm'.

We have introduced the concept of pulse through a variety of experiences which include pulse games and other rhythmic activities, the creation of patterns, including ostinati, and repetitive rhythmic textures – cyclic and polyrhythms, listening activities and the composition and performance of class and group rhythm pieces. Through composing and performing, the children have been introduced to rhythm grids and rhythm grid notation which has been extended to include single line rhythm notation using the note values of a semibreve, minim, crotchet, quaver and pair of quavers.

The children have worked well in groups and enjoyed composing and performing their own rhythms in front of their peers.









KS3 Art and Design

Year 7 this term have produced a great variety of Artwork. Here are some examples of their eye-catching work. Well done!!

Year 7 children in Art have been playing around with positive and negative space to create some interesting and beautiful Notan designs.



They have also enjoyed working in teams decorating the stairs with XL Artwork inspired by Keith Haring.




Year 7 enjoyed making *Elements of Art* booklets and examples of work putting the elements into practise. They also made $N\sigma$ *War* posters using perspective.



In Year 8 children have been working individually and in groups during our project "Cityscapes".

They have used mixed media, photocopies, tracing paper and collage to create various types of cityscapes. They have also looked at various artists work for inspiration.





Year 8 also revised their elements of Art from last year and created posters for the classroom.



They have also developed their drawing skills by doing lots of observational drawings this term.



KS3 School Council

Elections were held in each class to choose the representatives for the School Council. Two representatives were voted for each half term.

Meetings are held every Thursday lunchtime.

The aim of the School Council is to give Pupil's an official "voice" to express their opinions and also to suggest and implement changes in their school.

The class representatives discuss the ideas put forward by their peers and then the ideas are voted on to decide which should go forward for further discussion with Mrs Gemmell and the link teacher.

Where it is possible the ideas are given the go ahead with the results this term such as: Table Tennis Tournaments, Bats and Balls provided, Pet's Corner for photos, Mini Assemblies to start the school day, Board Game Donation Box, Bake Sale (Summer Term) etc.

The School Council representatives take responsibilities in the organisation of the events.


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


En Year 2 empezamos a profundizar más en ortografía y gramática y como sabéis lo estamos haciendo increíblemente bien, ¿a que sí?

Pero eso no es todo, en sociales y naturales hemos aprendido sobre la salud: la importancia de la alimentación, del ejercicio y de la visita al médico.





En Year 3 somos capaces de escribir casi con corrección, aunque, a veces, nos tienen que recordar que tenemos que empezar a escribir con letra mayúscula pero sólo a veces.... En sociales hemos aprendido cosas muy interesantes sobre España y cómo orientarnos con mapas, brújulas, planos, ..¡Así que estamos listos para imos de viaje!





En esta etapa central del curso hemos seguido avanzando en el estudio de la lengua española y en la adquisición de conocimientos en materias como las ciencias sociales y las ciencias naturales.

Los alumnos de Year 4 han progresado mucho a nivel escrito. En el Cuaderno de Competencias básicas se ha trabajado en diversas áreas dentro de cada unidad. En las clases de Ciencias sociales hemos incorporado textos resumidos de las lecciones y hemos presentado nuevo vocabulario. En Ciencias naturales nuestro cuaderno del trimestre, Para chuparse los dedos, les ha encantado. En Ortografía los alumnos se han esmerado en realizar correctamente todas las tareas propuestas, pasando de un nivel a otro con gran entusiasmo. El trabajo de grupo les ha servido de estímulo en esta actividad. En la clase de Lectura de los viernes hemos escuchado con gran atención historias como Un gigante en el bolsillo, Caos en Carnaval, El pequeño Cid, Érase una vez el mundo romano y muchas más.

Year 5

Los alumnos de Year 5 han estado centrados en el estudio de la tilde y en la realización de ejercicios prácticos sobre este tema. En su Cuademo de Competencias básicas han completado actividades de gramática y han hecho redacciones muy interesantes. La poesía también ha estado presente en las clases y hemos aprendido la diferencia entre leer y recitar. Para nuestras clases de Sociales y Naturales hemos contado con la herramienta digital que nos proporciona EduBook. Hasta el momento llevamos revisados temas como el planeta Tierra, el tiempo atmosférico, el agua en la Tierra, el relieve y las rocas, el clima, los animales invertebrados, las plantas o la materia y los materiales. Las actividades online han ocupado gran parte del tiempo dedicado a tareas de repaso. En Lectura estamos terminando el libro El sabueso de los Baskerville. La intriga ha estado presente todo el tiempo y la sorpresa nos aguarda en el desenlace final.

Year 6

Los alumnos de Year 6 están realizando un trabajo fantástico a nivel escrito. Manejan con facilidad la expresión y se desenvuelven bien a la hora de hacer resúmenes de las lecciones. Ponen mucha atención en cuidar los elementos de la presentación en sus tareas: caligrafía, márgenes, párrafos, fecha, título, signos de puntuación y palabras destacadas. Para completar actividades de los distintos temas cuentan, como siempre, con su Cuademo de Competencias básicas. En Conocimiento del medio hemos hecho un repaso general de distintos temas: la biodiversidad, la Amazonia, las zonas climáticas, los climas de España, fuerzas y energía o materia y materiales. Seguimos avanzando a buen ritmo en las clases de Ortografía, adquiriendo vocabulario y perfeccionando el uso de la tilde. En la clase de Lectura hemos terminado de leer Un yanqui en la corte del rey Arturo, El príncipe feliz y El gigante egoísta, y hemos comenzado la lectura de Los cuentos de la Alhambra para niños.

Year 7


Los alumnos de Year 7 han estado trabajando a fondo en los temas del segundo trimestre, entre los que se incluyen la acentuación (tilde en agudas, llanas, esdríjulas, sobreesdríjulas, acentuación diacrítica, acentuación en palabras compuestas y en adverbios con la terminación en —mente, acentuación de formas interrogativas y exclamativas y acentuación de formas verbales con pronombres enclíticos) y el estudio de las distintas categorías de palabras (determinantes, pronombres, preposiciones, conjunciones, adverbios...). También han estado preparando las lecciones correspondientes a la asignatura de Ciencias sociales. En Ortografía seguimos aprendiendo cómo aplicar las normas aprendidas en ejercicios prácticos a través de los cuadernos de la editorial Anaya. En la clase de Lectura vamos a cambiar la narrativa de El valle de los lobos por una obra de teatro clásica, La vida es sueño. Pero esto será en el próximo trimestre. Hay que destacar, entre los trabajos presentados en estos primeros meses del año, la buena acogida que han tenido las exposiciones de Los Juegos Olímpicos de invierno o Las auroras boreales. Enhorabuena a todos los alumnos que han aportado espectaculares ideas para desarrollar estos temas.

Los alumnos de Year 8 han seguido avanzando en la revisión de los Retos propuestos en el libro de Lengua castellana de 1º de ESO: la descripción, el cuento, la exposición, determinantes, pronombres y otras categorías de palabras. Además de realizar las actividades digitales de la plataforma de Teide, los alumnos han podido completar ejercicios en sus cuadernos de Gramática y de Lectura y comprensión lectora. También hemos terminado el estudio de las lecciones de Geografía y hemos abordado de manera más detallada el tema de los problemas medioambientales. Los alumnos lo han estudiado y han sido capaces de desarrollar por escrito de forma extensa los conocimientos adquiridos. A partir de ahora nos centraremos en la materia de Historia. En Ortografía el trabajo requiere mucha concentración, ya que a este nivel se exige al alumno un alto grado de competencia en la aplicación de las normas aprendidas. En la clase de Lectura hemos pasado del género dramático de El sí de las niñas a la novela picaresca con la lectura de El lazarillo de Tormes. Las aventuras del lazarillo están asombrando a sus lectores.

Esperamos y deseamos que el último trimestre de este curso venga lleno de retos apasionantes para que nuestros estudiantes puedan seguir mostrando todas sus capacidades y talentos.




We have had a fantastic second term in Computing!


