


Summer 2022 Newsletter

Nursery

This term in Nursery we have been looking at the topics "Transport", "Under the Sea" and "Summer".

We have had a fun term in Year 1 and continued to work really hard.



After Easter we studied forces and magnets and had a fantastic time using them. We looked at the forces acting on objects, investigated the effects of friction on different surfaces and sorted magnetic and non-magnetic materials. We also examined the strength of magnets and explored magnetic poles.

Year 4

We have made it to the end of the school year and what a great year it has been in year 4! Despite the challenges we have continued to face this year with the global pandemic, the boys and girls have arrived to school with a positive and motivated attitude and worked conscientiously. They have showed great resilience and tenacity in order to prepare themselves for year 5. Below we will tell you about everything we have been learning from the curriculum.

Maths

We have been very impressed by Year 4's great work ethic in Maths during the summer term. The children tried their best to achieve the Times Tables certificate from Mrs Gemmell. We made great progress finding out about the properties of 2D and 3D shapes. Students also gained confidence using decimal numbers and rounding decimal numbers. They also really enjoyed multiplying and dividing by 10 and 100. Furthermore we solidified our knowledge of decimals, as well as finding equivalent and simplifying fractions. We also looked at negative numbers and reading temperature on a thermometer. Finally we found out how to find the perimeter and area of shapes. We enjoyed using games and songs to enhance our learning. Now we have to continue to improve our maths reasoning skills and work hard to understand word problems better. Well done boys and girls!



To be ready for Year 5, we hope all students of Year 4 will know their times tables and division facts. Remember to keep practising your Maths over the summer!

English

This term our class novel was the Iron Man. The pupils quickly became engrossed into this book and they were intrigued to find out what was going to happen next. We also became fantastic poets and created our own poems using personification, simile and metaphor. Year 4 had fun writing an amazing mystery "Recipe" poem and presented it to the rest of the class!

We expanded our grammar knowledge and became more confident applying these concepts to writing.

We had a great time celebrating World Book Day and the children did some special activities on this day and designed some fantastic front covers for their favourite books!






Each week, we continued to go to the library to get new books to read. Furthermore, we read Oxford Reading Tree books to improve our comprehension. We would encourage the children to read as much as they can during the summer holiday and keep a diary to improve their writing. 
<u>Science</u>

In Science the students continued to learn about sound: we learnt all about how sound travels to our ears; we learnt new scientific vocabulary such as wavelength, frequency and pitch; and we had great fun making our own telephones using plastic cups and string. We were able to send secret messages to each other!



In the second part of the term, we have learnt all about Electricity. We know how to make a circuit and what makes a circuit complete or incomplete. The children had great fun going down to the laboratory to make their own circuits using lightbulbs, motors, buzzers and switches. They also had a great time on the trip, completing an electricity workshop at the science museum!









<u>History</u>

Our History topic this term was The Vikings. We found out were they came from and why they travelled to conquer new lands. We also learnt about the Anglo Saxon kings at that time. The children enjoyed finding out about how the Vikings lived and about some of their traditions. There were some very severe punishments for crimes committed in those days and the pupils were certainly shocked by some of them. The children had an amazing time preparing our Summer Show all about the Vikings. We were able to dress up, make Viking helmets, learn more about Viking artefacts, sing some fun songs and do some crazy dancing! Well done Year 4!







Geography

This term we have been studying volcanos. The children have found it fascinating studying the location of volcanos, the causes and effects of their eruptions, and learning all about specific recent and historical case studies of volcanic activity. The children have worked very hard this term and we have been very impressed by their engagement with geography.

Art / DT

This term, as a result of linking our Design & Technology topic and our History topic, the children designed and constructed individual model Viking boats using a range of materials including cardboard, clay, wood and textiles. They showed great care and consideration in the planning and construction of these creations and should be proud of their end product. Children also made small Viking Shields, creating their own original design using paints.

Year 5

Learning about the assassination of Archduke Franz Ferdinand, the Battle of the Somme, technological advancements and how the war ended (not to mention the various tangents our discussions took us on) were all listened to attentively.

During this term Year 5 have been on some extremely enjoyable trips. We started with canoeing in which the children learned how to canoe in teams of three. Once canoeing



to the other side of the lake the children swam in the water and refreshed themselves, some had fun trying to splash their teachers. Others had more respect \odot

Year 5 enjoyed this time with their class mates and thoroughly enjoyed some much needed relaxation time after a hard term of vigorous work. Year 6

Time is passing so quickly however they do say that time passes quickly when you are having fun! We can't believe that we are now saying passing on our Year Six students to Key Stage Three. We have performed our show Goodbye My Friends, we have been on two super excursions, some of us have been off on the Residential Course and of course



we have completed the dreaded SAT exams. We would like to take this opportunity to share some of our experiences with you.



In English, Year 6B has loved reading the book Charlotte's Web by E.B. White. It tells the charming story of a little girl called Fern who rescues the runt of a pig litter called Wilbur. The two become inseparable and are guided through the trials of life by a beautiful large gray spider called Charlotte.

In Year 6A the children have been charmed by the book "Who Let the Gods Out" by Maz Evans. It tells the story of Eliot, whose mum is ill and his home is under threat. A shooting star crashes to earth and changes his life forever.


Along with weekly visits to the Library the children have also been continuing to investigate their weekly grammar concepts and spelling patterns.



In Mathematics, the children have continued to follow the abacus programme. During the first half term the children have been learning the difference between mean, median and mode. Additionally, they have consolidated their calculation skills and learned the concept of long division. After the Spring Break we have focused on SAT exams. We have practised how to develop exam technique while building up the confidence to work independently. The children performed so well and showed great maturity in their attitude to these first important exams. Well done to each and every one of you.







The first unit year 6 studied was 'Electricity'. The children have been learning about the main circuit symbols and they have been using these to draw circuit diagrams. Furthermore, they have had the opportunity to investigate how our understanding of electricity has changed over time and the children will gain more experience of planning scientific investigations in the next term.

In the second part of term we have looked at Light, Reflection and Shadow. We have also looked at Renewable Energy Sources. With the growing costs of petrol we have looked at the advantages of being more self-sustained as economies struggle to transport goods around Europe.



The history topic of World War II has taken the children on a journey over the centuries to look at how the Role of Women in Society has developed from Ancient Egypt to modern times. We have had lots of debate and indignation about how unfairly women have been treated and enjoyed the successes that so many women enjoy now. The children were all very interested in this topic.



Finally we were able to have parents and family present to watch outdoor productions of the show entitled Good Bye My Friends. This was a fun play which showed Year Six



children reminiscing about their primary school days. The music was fun, the children sang so well and the performances were outstanding. Congratulations to each and every one of you.









This term the children have had three school field trips. We thoroughly enjoyed our visit to Sputnik Climbing Centre. The children were respectful of rules and regulations and were praised by the monitors for their excellent behavior. We returned to the Science Museum for a Work Shop on Light and Colour which tied in perfectly with our second unit of work. On our third trip we had fun in the crazy Illusions Museum. Three fun trips enjoyed by all.

<u>Maths</u>


This term, our KS3 students have revised statistics and probability topics. They have learned how to interpret and plot results on different graphs and charts; they've also been introduced to stem-leaf diagrams.

During our last week of term, KS3 pupils' conducted a school survey. They had the opportunity to go around the school and get information from Numont students about their favourite subject, nationalities, religious backgrounds etc. Our students then used these results to plot pie charts and decorate posters. They all enjoyed this experience and valued the opportunity to learn more about their school.

Everyone has worked very hard for their end-of-year assessment and deserves to rest and do something different during the summer months. I hope you all have a lovely summer vacation and we look forward to seeing you all in September.







English Literature

This term, class 7A has read The Old Man and the Sea, class 7B has read The Diary of a Young Girl (Anne Frank), and year 8 has studied Twelfth Night. I have been impressed by students' progress throughout this year and it has been wonderful to see them engaging with the books, acting out scenes, debating topics and writing fantastic essays.

English Language

Year 7: This term in English language we have studied the topic "Making the News". Students had a great time reading, researching and writing news stories. Students have learnt about the different professions which are essential to produce news stories. At the end of term students worked in groups to produce their own video news broadcasts, I was very impressed by their final videos!

Year 8: This term in English language we have studied "The Power of Communication". Students have theorised about the power communication holds in influencing the behaviours and decisions of others. They have studied persuasive techniques and have practised using the power of persuasion in their writing. Students also enjoyed pitching products to each other to win the title of most persuasive presenter.

<u>Geography</u>

Year 7: This term we have studied the history and physical features of Africa. Students have learnt how to read maps and analyse data from graphs, charts and tables. Each student researched and presented a project about a country in Africa. I was very impressed by their research, presentation and presenting skills. They should all be very proud of their hard work!



Year 8: This term we have studied the history and physical features of Asia. Students have learnt how to read maps and analyse data from graphs, charts and tables. I have been very impressed by students' locational knowledge and geopolitical understanding of the region. At the end of term the class worked together to revise the topic of Climate Change, they created a fantastic video on the importance of changing our actions to limit climate change.

<u>Science</u>

This last term Year 7 has been finishing our science topics with units on microorganisms, earth physics such as eclipses, natural disasters and sound, and simple chemical reactions. We've enjoyed a few lab practicals where we refined our basic lab skills.

Year 8 have covered the topics of chemical reactions and magnetism and electromagnetisms.

The big event this term was the end of term Science Fair. The teachers and the whole lower school were very impressed with the quality of the projects. There were water pressure powered mechanical arms, volcanoes, non-Newtonian fluids, lollipop makers, a milkshake machine, rainbow flames, and more!

We are very proud of the work all the students have done this year and wish you all the loveliest of summers!























<u>Art</u>

Year 7 have learned about Picasso this term and worked in teams to produce one final piece together. It has helped them to learn to work in teams, to guide and help each other and to look at detail and observe carefully. The final pieces are colourful and looked great in the class walls.









Year 8 has continued with cityscapes and have also been encouraged to work in teams to create larger pieces of Art work. They particularly liked the Circular art project and painting their final design on wood.





Both year 7 and 8 have done lots of observational drawings this term, objects, plant observations, still lifes to gain confidence and improve their technique.










KS3 also enjoyed listening and learning how Miss Jessica illustrated her book. The whole process from where she got her inspiration and ideas to the final printed book.







ICT

In Key Stage 2 and Year 7, the children have been programming this term.


Year 3 has been introduced to the basic concepts. They were pirates and with their coding they found different items.
